Mayor's Opening Comments:

The City of Orange City intends to adopt a millage rate and budget for Fiscal Year 2017/2018. The rolled-back rate is 7.0466 and the proposed millage rate is 8.2101 mills which is 16.51% above the rolled-back rate as provided by the Property Appraiser of Volusia County.
