SUBJECT: Surplus Inventory/Request to Donate

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 274, Florida Statutes, the City Council must declare surplus and authorize the disposal of all tangible personal property owned by the City of a non-consumable nature. The City currently uses the services of George Gideon Auctioneers in Zellwood, Florida who is under contract with Volusia County until September 30, 2018. The Auctioneer typically picks up all approved City surplus and combines smaller miscellaneous surplus in lots of like items to increase value. A recent request to declare items as surplus and disposal approved by the City Council returned \$17,430.78 to the City. The City intends to sell all serviceable vehicles on a separate public auction internet site to maximize competition among bidders. Attached is a detailed list of the City's current out-of-stock, obsolete equipment, furnishings and miscellaneous items, which should be declared surplus at this time.

Included on the attached surplus list are twenty-seven X26 tasers, including miscellaneous accessories from the Orange City Police Department (OCPD). OCPD recently transitioned from the X26 taser to the new X26P smart taser. The X26P smart taser is the new generation of smart taser devices and is far more technologically advanced than the older X26 model, providing a more reliable deployment. For public safety reasons, it is the OCPD's internal policy that all tasers are destroyed or may be donated to other eligible agencies. The OCPD has determined

that approximately 15 of the 27 tasers are still functional. A decision was made to surplus the functioning X26 tasers due to non-interchangeable accessories (batteries, holsters, etc.) and training variations due to operational and functional differences between the X26 taser and the X26P smart taser. The City has received a request from Chief Walker, City of Lake Helen, to accept any of the functioning tasers, including accessories.

Staff recommends Council declare the items surplus as detailed on the attached list and authorize the disposal of those items by sale or other appropriate means as determined by the City Manager and approve the donation request submitted by City of Lake Helen for the functioning tasers and accessories.
